Take A Day Trip

A plethora of exciting, interesting, and fun places await you just North of Ocean Drive, across the North Carolina line. Head out on Highway 17 but not too far. Reavis, 'Queen of Shag,' lauded

Ed Monsour was 13 when he first danced with Clarence Reavis. He said dancing with the woman known as the "Queen of Shag" changed his life. Mr. Monsour, now 68, said that dance 53 years ago hooked him on shagging and led to hundreds of dances with Ms. Reavis and other friends. "She represented a dance that we all enjoyed because of the camaraderie that she brought with it," he said. Ms. Reavis was famous for her dancing, but her family and friends remembered her Saturday as a vivacious woman who loved everyone. Ms. Reavis died on Friday. She was 86. "She was the most passionate person that this town has ever seen. She radiated electricity," said Karen Durrell, one of the many who counted Ms. Reavis as their best friend. "To this day, if she walked into a room, people would turn around and say, 'Who is that person?'" These eyes!

Ms. Reavis had eyes that could read straight through to a person's soul, Ms. Durrell said. Those eyes read Harold Bessent, the owner of Fat Harold's Beach Club in North Myrtle Beach. The two were soul mates, Mr.

Bessent said. Ms. Reavis once bought Mr. Bessent a copy of a collection of poetry, "This is My Beloved" by Walter Benton. She loved to read. If anyone mentioned a book to Ms. Reavis, she would buy it, sign it and give the person the copy. Her son, James Reavis Jr., said his mother was the hub of a wheel with hundreds of spokes. "My mother's family was way much bigger than me," he said. "I had to share my mother with so many people. It means the most to me to see so many people who enjoyed my mother. They didn't call her a queen

type of thing they have in New Orleans, where they celebrate someone's life. They don't mourn. They're happy. They've gone to a better place." In light of her will, Mr. Reavis plans to hold a dance at Fat Harold's Beach Club, the same place where Ms. Reavis was inducted into the Shaggers Hall of Fame in 1983. About 800 people crowded into the club in 1995 to celebrate Ms. Reavis' 80th birthday. Ms. Reavis was born in Marion, S.C., in 1915. "My mother said that if I was in my crib and they played music, I would shake my booty," Ms. Reavis said in

Mr. Reavis spoke about his mother after a memorial service Saturday at First Baptist Church on Anderson Street. For years, Ms. Reavis had said that when she died, she wanted no mourning or sadness, Mr. Reavis said. "My mother wanted the

an interview in 1995. From day one!

From the crib, Ms. Reavis went straight to the dance floor, traveling to dances across North Carolina and South Carolina. During the summer she would dance in Myrtle Beach with a group of friends who called themselves "the rat pack," Marilyn

Smith, Charlie Boone, Harry Driver and Mr. Monsour. She met her husband, Harold Reavis, at a dance in 1933 at White Lake and married him in 1937. They divorced 31 years later. Ms. Reavis lived in Fayetteville for about 55 years. She owned Clarence's Jewelry Shop in Biltmore Village Shopping Center in the 1970s. The business went bankrupt after eight years. Mr. Monsour said Ms. Reavis gave credit to everyone, thinking they would be nice enough to pay her back. "She didn't have the killer instinct to be a retailer," Mr. Monsour said. Ms. Reavis continued dancing, even after she broke her hip when she was 75. Her last dance was two weeks ago at the Len-Care Rest Home in Fayetteville, where she was living. Mr. Bessent said he talked with Ms. Reavis for the last time on Christmas Eve. Ms. Reavis told Mr. Bessent she would not live to see the new year. She said, "I won't be here. I'm going home to a lot of places, but we're still real sisters."

A Beginner's Guide To S.O.S.

From The Shag, Twister's Shag Club Newsletter

At the last Twister's Shag Club meeting, we had a discussion about our great newsletter. One of the newer members said "I'd like to see an article on S.O.S since we've never been". So, never being one to take myself too seriously, I couldn't wait to pen my thoughts.

The novice can never really prepare for what he will experience at S.O.S. But, with this "Training Guide" he will survive. This plan will work best if started at least four weeks before S.O.S., and if it is followed verbatim.

-Equipment Required-

1. A high output sound system with a minimum of 2 large speakers
2. A small uneven table (Folded napkins used for leveling are optional.)
3. A Port-A-John (Do not label "Men" or "Women")
4. Several dirty, smoky ashtrays
5. A small room with a 2 ft. x 4 ft. dance floor
6. A small bar placed against the wall, suspended on all sides, with bar stools

The Set-up:

Place the speakers in opposite corners of the room. Remember, when you

are "Training" the music must be really loud.

Have a loud discussion about who's fault it is. Then both of you walk outside for about 15 more minutes. This will simulate going back to mom to get the S.O.S. cards. (For the purpose of training, we will not simulate having to drive all the way back to the house, or having to purchase two more cards at the beach.)

By this time, the party is ready for your next Training exercise. As you try to make your way to the bar, have several people tell you about all of the fun that you've already missed. Practice saying the phrases "When did ya'll get here?" and "When are you going back?". You'll need to repeat these phrases many times. Perfecting them will make you sound like an old pro.

Try to get in front of a speaker to carry on any conversations. This gets your

vocal chords ready for the real event. Next, get a crowd together and have someone tell about the killer party you recently missed. Now, it is time for the "drop a drink" drill. Practice dropping it close to your feet, and absolutely soaking yourself (or someone standing close) from the knees down. As you jump back from the dropped drink, be sure to kick into a lit cigarette and burn a hole into your brand new pants or dress.

When your favorite song comes on, it's time to dance. First, set your beer on the table; the uneven one with 200 beers at various levels of consumption already sitting there. Then, take your partner's hand and try to get to the floor. Be sure the two couples you got for their mirror step ability are on the floor at this time. Squeeze onto the floor and start dancing. Have one of the guys with the real heavy weepers lock you on the ankles. Continue this for about 4-5 hours. Repeat this important exercise at least 2-3 times every week.

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DOWN MEMORY LANE

By Johnny Hammard

Jamesetta Hawkins was born in 1938. She came into the world carrying a lot of baggage. She was the product of a brief love affair between a hot-blooded Italian and a wayward, teenage black girl. She was immediately dumped into her grandmother's lap, at the age of 11, she went to live with her unemployed, alcoholic mother in San Francisco. From the time she arrived home from school until whenever, she did as she pleased because her mother was seldom at home. It didn't take long for her to become a "wild child," running around with older boys, drinking, smoking pot, and getting tattooed.

About the only thing her mother was strict about was her musical taste. Dear old mom was a die-hard jazz fan and didn't want her daughter listening to no gytucker blues. But, around the corner, at her friend Sugar DeSant's house, Jamesetta was able to listen to and sing the type of rhythm and blues she and other young people adored.

In 1954, when she was 15, she and her friends auditioned for the legendary talent scout and band leader, Johnny Otis. Otis was so impressed with her mature vocal lead and perfect timing that he wanted to take her to L.A. to record. Jamesetta lied about her age, saying that she was 18, but Otis still needed her mother's permission so he sent a permission slip home with her to be signed. Jamesetta failed to tell Otis that her mother was in jail so she forged her name and took off for L.A.

This was a new life and she loved it even more than she could ever imagine. Everything was falling into place. She felt that she had it all. New life, new clothes, new friends, and, now it was time for a new name. The name she chose was broken up and reversed, Jamesetta, Etta James.

The first record she co-wrote with Johnny Otis and recorded with his band became a beach music classic: *Roll With Me, Henry* was the answer to the Midwestern's *Work With Me, Annie* and *Annie Had a Baby*. The record company thought it was a little too racy and suggestive so they released it as *The Wallflower*. Her mother, Miss Georgia Gibbs, covered it as *Dance With Me, Henry*. It shot up to the top of the Pop Chart. Etta's topped the R&B Chart. In 1955, she came back with another R&B chartbuster that also

became a beach music classic called, *Good Rockin' Tonight*. I'm here to tell you, *Teddy Bear*, it was indeed a disc of solid gold.

After '55, Etta dropped off the charts for nearly five years, although she continued to tour. I remember seeing her during this period and, I'm telling ya, she could knock out a number and make 'em beg for more. She remained a favorite of beach music lovers for decades. From the mid-50's to the late 60's, the only R&B vocalists to have Top Ten hits than Etta were Ruth Brown and Dinah Washington.

Etta James could do it all. She had great vitality and the ability to modify her style as musical trends changed. She was a powerhouse who could alternate toughness and tenderness. Not only was she a top R&B and Soul singer, she was equally comfortable with Pop, Rock, Jazz, Rock 'n Roll, down home blues, and right down to and including Country. Her version of *Aleppo Persuaded* made the Country Charts. Yes, Sir, she be good!

In 1960, Etta signed with Chess Records, mainly because the Moonglows were recording there and she was having an affair with Harvey Fugura, their lead singer. She teamed up with Harvey to do *If I Can't Have You*. The song reached number 3 on the Soul Chart and they were voted the Soul Duo of the year. Etta demonstrated a style somewhat different from her earlier efforts. It had considerable soul Gospel and Blues content rather than the rough, strident infections of old-time R&B. This is when her music crossed over to the Pop Chart. From 1960 to 1968, she placed nine songs in the Top 40.

I think of the 60's as Phase II of her career. She was dubbed "Queen of Soul" and charted such classic hits as *All I Could Do Was Cry* in '60, and the '61 hit, *At Last*. My favorite from this era is the much-covered *Something's Got a Hold On Me*, released in '62. the following year she had her biggest Pop hit of the 60's in *Punkover*. It's ironic that her '65 hit, *Do I Make Myself Clear*, and the '68 hit, *In the Basement* were duos with her childhood friend, Sugar DeSant.

Etta's years as a party girl finally caught up with her in the mid-60's when she was sidelined for long periods of time. But, she fought back and somehow managed to keep going, despite occasional lapses. In '67, she did

Tell Mama, and in the late 70's, *Locators*, plus a whole string of albums from '61 to '71.

the early 70's, what I refer to as Phase III, looked as if the end was near. She jumped on the old white train and rode it hard. Heroin, the drug of her choice, had taken its toll. By 1971, Etta was without a recording contract. She had reached the bottom of the pit. Her career was sliding fast, and her health had deteriorated to the point she thought she was dying. She finally entered a drug rehab in late 1972. She was there for one-and-a-half years. Her peers never gave up on her, nor did the critics. She was one helluva talent and, when she was clean, Chess Records gave her a call. They had one more album for her to do. It was raw Rhythm and Blues and it was Etta James. They called it, *Etta Is Etta That's Evah*. I think that says it all.

Once she was drug free, she started another comeback. With much support from her many friends, and the fire need to do her music, she started with the small club and house Festivals. Movies and TV started using her music for background settings. The movie, *Back to the Future*, used *Roll*



With Me Henry, and *Heartbreaker* used *The Blues Don't Lie*. I remember in the episode of *Insiders*, the song was playing in a bar scene.

Today, the shag world is enjoying a number of her old R&B hits, such as, *Strange Man*, *Singin' the Blues*, *I Got the Hill*, and, my favorite, *Body, What You Want Me To Do*.

Etta James was inducted into the Rock 'n Roll Hall of Fame in 1993. Believe it or not, she has a new album titled, *Love's Been Rough on Me*. She digs deep into a bag of South Soul tunes filled with heartache and regret, including a pleading, desperate run through of *One Rockin' & I Been Loving You Too Long*. A very but determined strength shines through all the words of sadness, leaving no doubt that however rough love or life might be, Etta James is sure to survive with a song on her lips.



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


He chaired the Inland Throwdown, Summer Jackpot Party and Junior Shaggers events. He was one of the prime movers and shakers of our club.

For the last two years, Chuck and Shirley taught jive on the area to shag. This Sunday afternoon event drew large crowds, and one student, Josh Key, went on to win several contests.

Chuck has served on the SOS Board for the past six years, and during this time he helped organize the first Fun Monday, and has worked with the Entertainment Committee, which gives back to the shagging community a great event in Fun Monday. Chuck was also the chair for the "Wellcome to Ocean Drive, Home of SOS" sign placed on Main Street in 1998. Chuck's enthusiasm and wisdom will be missed by the SOS Board.

Chuck loved his family, his country, his friends and especially the shaggers. He retired as a major from the National Guard, was a boy scout leader for 10 years, was very active in his church, serving as Sunday School Superintendent, Church moderator and received a 12 year pin for perfect attendance.

Chuck also served as Captain in the Southern Pines Volunteer Fire Department, and was appointed to the Southern Pines Planning Board which he chaired for three years. During this time, he was active in the local Jaycees.

**Former USC Mascot, "Cocky"
A Shagger?**

Gerrit Humphries, a native of Gaffney, South Carolina, experienced the thrill of a lifetime, as he was the former mascot "Cocky" for the University of South Carolina. According to USC rules and regulations, Cocky's true identity must be kept a secret until graduation. Last May, Humphries was able to reveal his identity when he walked across the stage at graduation to receive his diploma. Humphries was the well-known mascot for three years of his college experience.

Humphries is also a shagger who has competed on the circuit for the past four years. He has been dancing for the past 5 years and won a top finalist at the Nationals in 2000 and 2001. He was also a member of the National Shag Dance Team in 2000-2001. Humphries learned to dance from his mother, Lorrie O'Donald. "She has been the biggest inspiration to me as far as dancing," Humphries said. "My mother is probably the only reason I am dancing today. She encouraged me to start dancing when I was a senior in high school and I've loved it ever since." Humphries and his mother were the 2001 winners of



the "Smoothies" contest during Spring SOS and have danced in many other local and regional contests. "I always love to enter a contest with my mother because she still has what it takes and it brings the both of us to dance together," said Humphries. His former Nationals partners include Krystal Taylor and Nikki Johnson, whom were the only Humphries placed top finalists with in Nationals.

Not only did Humphries achieve his goal of ranking at the National Shag Championships, he obtained his goal of becoming USC's mascot. During his years at USC, Humphries was the inspiration of the

young and old. He had to appear at 4 major sporting events during the year, and countless University and Regional appearances. "The experience I had during the 3 years is one I will never forget. The most thrilling time in the suit was when I had the ability to whip over 80,000 people into a frenzy during the beginning of the games while the song "1091" was playing."

It became the famous mascot in the spring of 1998 and ended his career upon graduation in the spring



of 2001. Being Cocky was very demanding for Humphries. He had to make anywhere from 10-20 appearances per week and also attend school full-time. "It's all about time management. The hardest time of the year for me would be during the spring semester. I was performing my Cocky duties, going to school, working and also trying to practice on the weekend for the National Shag Championships. This is when I found myself doing too much sometimes."

Humphries also obtained the goal of becoming the #1 Mascot in the Nation last year at the Universal Cheerleaders Association National Mascot Championships held at Disney World. He obtained this goal through many months of hard work and dedication. A 3-minute video tape was submitted for entry into the competition, which he worked on for 9 months. Upon his acceptance to finals, Humphries immediately began working on his suit for Nationals. After the finals, Humphries achieved one of his ultimate goals, to become one of the top 3 mascots in the nation.

Gerrit is now obtaining his Masters of Hotel, Restaurant, and Tourism Management from the University of South Carolina. He will never forget the memories from his years as "Cocky", and he'll have memories to pass through dancing.

Thanks for any help you can give us and for all those you have helped in the past. Hope to see you at Dicks soon and like the sign at the door says "Welcome Home to Dick's!"

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
Boilerplate

Editor's Note: This little column will be repeated in each Spring Safari and Fall Migration issues of the "Carefree Times" pretty much as it is presented here. These are simply the basic rules of S.O.S. which are designed to increase the pleasure of the weekend for all stranders. They are repeated both for new users for information and old timers as a reminder.

1. The SOS Board has adopted the policy of not replacing SOS Membership cards for any reason. This includes cards that have been lost, stolen, misplaced, left at home, or concavely cards, or whatever. No one at SOS Headquarters, The Company Store, or any SOS Club selling cards are authorized by the SOS Board to issue a replacement card. Please do not request anyone at these locations to do so.
2. SOS Membership cards are non-transferable.
3. There will be a \$15 charge for all returned checks.
4. Glasses, case, disks, or bottle caps can be carried in any club. This is against South Carolina law and will be enforced in all participating clubs.
5. Accepting membership in L.O.S. constitutes agreement to respect and comply with all ordinances of the city of North Myrtle Beach.
6. Official SOS membership cards are sold only from SOS, P.O. Box 27699, Rock Hill, SC 29732, and the participating clubs. MEMBERSHIP CARDS ARE NEVER SOLD ON THE STREET OR AT LOCAL PARTIES. Counterfeit cards will be confiscated and replacement will not be issued.
7. SOS will pay a \$200 reward and lifetime membership to anyone who presents evidence which convicts a person or persons for selling counterfeit cards.
8. To receive SOS discounts from participating merchants and restaurants, your SOS card must be presented before you order.
9. SOS cards are valid only when in the possession of persons 21 years old or older. Persons below 21 years old will not be admitted to clubs.

Things That Work

1) Fleas or bugs bothering you? Spray them with hairspray and they will take a quick dive.

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

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
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Dancing the Night Away

Shag Club is ready for its annual benefit

"We have 190 members of the shag club, and not all of them dance," said Rick Turner, president of the area shag club. "We just want people to come out and have a good time."

The Burlington Shag Club was organized in 1984 by area shaggers who wanted to get together and dance. Every Friday from 9 PM. to 1 AM., members of the club meet at Mason's Grill and Pub at the Rambler Inn "just to dance," Turner said.

"It's not all about going out and partying and having a good time," Turner said of the club. "People don't know what we do for the community."

Since 1993, the club has raised \$190,000 in funding for Special Olympics and Meals on Wheels combined. The first fund raiser for Meals on Wheels was held in 1993 at Al's Fine Foods; it was the brainchild of Al Fogelman, a member of the club. After the restaurant closed, the event was moved to the Rambler Inn, where it has been since 1995. Last year's dinner/dance earned \$27,000 for Meals on Wheels. The golf tournament, which began in 1995, raised \$8,300 for Special

Olympics.

"It's great we get this money,

said Anne Haberly, executive director for Alamance County Meals on Wheels, a United Way agency that sends 360 meals daily to Alamance, Caswell, Guilford and Orange Counties. "Without it, 100 clients wouldn't eat."

Hot and frozen meals are served to 100,000 clients a year. Funding is donated from private businesses, churches and individuals.

"We've seen a huge increase in the number of clients in the last five years, mainly because of the growing elderly population," Haberly added.

The community has joined the effort to raise funds. This year's major sponsor is First State Bank in Burlington. Area and statewide sponsors donate prizes for the silent auction. Items up for auction include paintings from artists Thomas Kinkade and Joe Bodie, jewelry from Hayes Jewelry in Lexington, rounds of golf from Myrtle Beach golf courses, and tickets to the Carolina Opry.

"There's a lot of shag events all over the state," Al Fogelman said. "But not many of them do what we do for the community."
