
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### Welcome to the special Holiday Fifth Edition of Tips and Tidbits








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### So Who is Dr. Phil? Reprinted from Dr. Phil Sawyer

By all odds, I should have been hanging around the filling station learning how to put hot patches on red rubber inner tubes and fix carburetors. That's what boys in rural South Carolina during the early 40s did. But instead, I was hanging around the only store in Sally, South Carolina that sold records playing Harry James and Benny Goodman, and learning to dance. We did a pretty fair country jitterbug from what we saw in the WW II movies (Stage Door Canteen). I first saw shagging at the Roberts Pavilion at Ocean Drive in 1945. I was smitten. In those days, no one taught you to dance--you had to watch and learn yourself. So watch we did and practice we did and somehow we learned to do it.

That little skill paid rich dividend throughout my years at the University of South Carolina. Only about 5% of the male students could "fast dance." Those of us who could reaped great benefits. I danced my way through Carolina, and even after I graduated, we danced around Columbia at places like the Web, the VFW and Amyets.

Chick and I were married in 1957. We continued to dance on week-ends, especially at the Fort Jackson Officer's Club, but by then, the Rock & Roll frenzy had hit the country, and good places to shag were hard to come by.

The renaissance of Shag in 1979 was like the rebirth of learning. All of a sudden, people were shagging everywhere. You all know the story. Shag clubs, week-end parties, S. O. S., bus trips, contest--the whole nine yards. We were back into it and thrilled to the bone.

I was a joiner and an organizer so I quickly became involved. I was president of the Columbia Shag Club, one of the founders of the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs and the Hall of Fame Foundation. As Chairman of the Board of the Association, I was responsible for taking 212 shaggers to Hawaii, and I was responsible for bringing S. O. S. to the Association. Chick and I were one the original Host Couples of Our Time. I originated the Columbia Shag Club Newsletter, the first local club letter in the Association.

I helped start shag clubs in Aiken, Orangeburg, Camden, Greenwood, South Strand, and Hilton Head. It is honor enough to be called a "shagger" but others have come my way--sorta like icing on the cake-including the Beach Shagger's Hall of Fame, the Wall of Fame, the Wall of Legends, and the DJ's Hall of Fame.

I could go on and on about my life in the shag world, but if you want to be short and to the point, just put me down as

Phil Sawyer--Shagger.



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### The Cost of a Shag Club-by Reneé Baker

Editors note: Reneè first put this on the Lancaster Shag Club's Facebook page. Have your members see this!

It takes more than just people showing up to dance to support a shag club.

Membership – Why pay a membership fee? Lots of people are content to pay more money for entrance to parties rather than save money by paying a membership fee and paying the lower entrance fee to parties, because they don't want to have to "do a job" in the club. Well, memberships are needed for clubs to survive. Clubs that are members of the ACSC have to pay a yearly fee (this also entitles you to buy your SOS card at a reduced amount). Clubs have to pay a fee to the one of the music associations in order for the DJs to be able to play artists music for the public. Clubs have expenses such as websites and their upkeep, newsletters to publish, flyers for parties or events, and other expenses just to exist. Membership money doesn't cover the cost of weekly or monthly parties.

Some clubs are fortunate enough to have a restaurant or club to support them and allow them to use their facilities free of charge. These clubs are few and far between. Most clubs have to pay rent for the facility and also pay for the DJ to play. Venues aren't cheap. This is why clubs must also charge a fee at the door for the party and sell raffle tickets and 50/50 tickets. An average club will have to pay at a minimum \$400 or maybe even \$600 to have a party. That would be \$4-\$6 a piece entrance fee for 100 people....see where I'm going with this? Then, even if you have a cash bar and members bring food or snacks, the club has to furnish plates, napkins, forks. Decorations? Not required, but people prefer a little something. You need tickets to have a raffle, paper, pens, books to keep track of people signing in, expenses, etc.

Our goal is to preserve and promote the shag. Shag lessons, events in the community, donations to our community or shag related causes...? Our officers are required to attend 3 of the mandatory meetings held by ACSC (who own and maintain SOS). Should these unpaid workers have to spend their own money for gas, food, rooms, and event fees to serve their club?

Money aside, parties don't just happen. You have members that serve as Officers and Board Members. Should they have to do ALL the work for the club? No. They are the representatives and final decision makers, but they alone can't do all the work. Parties have to have a venue, they need a date, a DJ, persons to get the room ready – set up tables, decorate, persons to man the door and sign in people, take up the money, someone to organize the food, persons to sell the raffle and 50/50 tickets, someone to make the announcements, people to clean up, someone to pay the venue and the DJ, someone to send updates and pictures to the webmaster and the editor of the newsletter. What about when the party is over. Someone has to publish the newsletter, coordinate Charity functions, make flyers for upcoming events, teach the shag lessons to get new members in.... the list goes on.

So what does it mean to be a member... let's see... Webster says a "constituent part of a whole". It takes the members working together as a whole to keep the group together. Everyone must play their part. Not everyone needs to perform the same task, and some are better at different tasks than others.

The club can't function without the members. Without the members, there is no party. Without a party, you don't get to talk to your friends and dance. Therefore, participate, support your club by coming to the dances, promote the club, work for the club, bring new friends in to further growth of the club, have an opinion and don't expect something for nothing.



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

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### Tips on being in the Spring SOS Parade

If you want to know the rules about the SOS Spring Parade, the person that has these answers is Don David, parade chairman. He is a wealth of information about the parade, and you will want to get to know Don better, as his advice is very important. I am going to give you some tips from another perspective, and that perspective is that of a relatively new participant to the parade, with some great success. If you want the advice of someone that has had great success for many years in a row, you would want to start with Joan Kimbro, president of the incredibly successful, Burlington Shag Club.

The first thing a shag club has to consider is, can we have an entry in the SOS Spring Parade? Many clubs are concerned about the cost and manpower. The cost all depends on how deeply involved you want to get. Manpower is a factor that helps to determine how elaborate your entry can be. I think that the wonderful benefit of the parade is that you get to showcase your shag club, and can do so based on whatever budget, and number of members that will be attending SOS. If cost is a significant factor, you can still enter the parade as a shagging troop, and your only cost is your outfits, or anything you decide to have that upgrades your performance. The next level would be best club car. If you want to be represented, you can just have a car, and people walking along side of it. If you are ready with your "A" game, and can afford a little money on a float, then you want to enter "Most Original", or "Best Shag Theme". Renting a float can cost around \$750. If I recall, that is how much we spent on our float rental. Our second float, we had a member that loaned us a very nice trailer. We were fortunate to win 1st place in the "Most Original" category. Following this, our Board decided to up the ante and our next entry will be on our all new customized trailer we had built just for parade floats. This is not cheap, but over the years it will be very cost effective. Get your membership involved and let them know you want to consider having a float. Be realistic, but convey that the benefits far outweigh the cost and hard work.

So, what I want you to take away from this is that every club can participate in the parade, and at worst, the cost can be very minimal. If your club raises money to have a float, utilizes some advertising, or comes up with a clever way to have a float, or club vehicle at an affordable cost, the camaraderie, team work, relationship building, and exposure your club gets, is priceless. We also do our local Christmas parade and this is a great way to showcase our club locally! This year is the 20th year of the parade. I encourage every club to participate in some fashion this year.
