MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: BILLY WALDREP

Bill Waldrep and I had a chance to discuss his thoughts and journey of shag. I admit that talking with Billy was like having the opportunity to savor a first taste of filet mignon. Billy was open and humble about his appreciation of the love of people and the music.

Here goes! -

Bill Waldrep attended Woodruff High School and furthered his education at Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC. Once he graduated he began with Phillips Fiber in manufacturing and was promoted to Technical Service representative where he traveled for the company.

It started with a girl as with most things. Billy would hitchhike to Myrtle Beach to the Pavillion where a Greenville gal taught him to shag. Billy was 18 & 19 years of age. As a young man, he listened to WLAC an AM station in Nashville. They played black artists -blues and he fell in love with the music. My guess is his transistor radio was by his pillow at night as he listened.



Billy attended the first SOS in 1980 and all other SOSs for over 30 + years. In 1998, during an introduction from Cooter Douglas about Billy's induction into the Hall of Fame; he said Billy "White Trash" Waldrep was Mayor of a trailer park. It stuck, but there is more to the story. Criteria must be met:

Billy's bio: Officer in the shag club, love for shag dance and music, taught lessons over 30 years, member of 7 or 8 shag clubs where he DJ'ed regularly, and was a business owner for dance

Billy taught shag with Sandy Coley & Elaine Cabness for years. He has judged contests in Florence, Charlotte, Greenville, Spartanburg, and Atlanta. When I asked him, "Did you compete," he commented, "I did see myself once or twice on video dancing with others like John English & Shad Alberty.

Mr White Trash Waldrep was a business owner with a group of investors who all loved the lifestyle and music of shag. They opened Club Sovy with operating manager Rick Hubbard, which later became the Sand Flea. As a reference point, Club Sovy was open before Ye Old Fireplace.



What thoughts do you have about being a DJ?

- 1- Be who you are!
- 2- Make the crowd happy and sometimes satisfying the crowd is difficult.
- 3- Speak to people and remember the songs they enjoy hearing

What is the best part of being a DJ? Watching friends dance and enjoying themselves.

What struck me was Billy's comment "All the money I have spent is nothing compared to the friends I have made."

In closing: There is nothing White Trash about Mr. Waldrep - just a catchy name. He is a friend, gentleman, statesman and ambassador. He has spent his life loving people, music, and the lifestyle of shag.

A NIGHT THAT CHANGED EVERYTHING

It was a night like any other—laughing, dancing, socializing at Fat Harold's, the soul of the shag community. But something happened that night that would change things forever. As I chatted with friends near the bar, a tap on my shoulder broke through the music: "Janice, someone is down in the back. We need your help." I rushed over. The staff knew I was an ICU nurse with over 35 years of experience, and although I didn't recognize anyone in the crowd huddled around the collapsed man, we moved as one—strangers working together seamlessly, like a seasoned trauma team.

CPR began immediately. It felt like an eternity as we waited for EMS, urging each beat of compressions to bring him back. When EMTs arrived, we helped guide them out the door quickly and safely. The staff at Fat Harold's rose to the moment—clearing paths, calming bystanders, assisting however they could. Afterward, we sat down, emotionally drained. We replayed every second, searching for ways it might have gone differently. And then it hit me: in the ICU, I always had what I needed—monitors, defibrillators, pulse oximeters. That night, we had nothing.

Why don't shag clubs have AEDs? Our crowd is aging. The stories aren't rare—someone collapsing from a stool or the dance floor. SOS has always been a great organization. Maybe they could help? I reached out to Ron and was happy to see AED's installed in all the shag nightclubs just before the next SOS. I was thrilled.

Then came the news: within the first week, an AED was used. That gentleman survived. He had open-heart surgery—and returned to Fat Harold's three weeks later. Talk about a full-circle moment.

I never learned the name of the man we lost that first night. But he was the spark that lit the fire. Because of him, lives will be saved. If you or someone you know was saved thanks to the AEDs in shag clubs, please share your story. Let's celebrate the lives preserved and the people who stepped up when it mattered most.

"Help! Call 911! Someone, please! Steve collapsed, I think he may be having a heart attack. Does anyone know what to do before the EMTs get here?" Alice, a panicked shag club member yelled.

"Do we do CPR? Who knows CPR?" Ralph asked, voice quivering...

A room full of upset and scared people could only guess and stress. The clock is ticking and every minute counts...

The Richmond Shag Club (RSC) is ready. Out of abundance of caution, the Richmond Shag Club Board of Directors decided to be as proactive as possible, ready to provide emergency aid to a member in need. The Board authorized the purchase of a semi-automated external defibrillator (AED) machine and to pay for three hours of hands-on AED training for ten members. Additionally, the RSC purchased an anti-choking devise and posted information at its weekly dance venue about how to identify a possible stroke victim.

Carolina Shag became the official dance of South Carolina in 1984 and the official dance of North Carolina in 2005. The RSC was founded by a small group of lovers of shag, bop and other forms of swing dance in 1986 and joined the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs (ACSC) in 1987. The RSC is proud that some of its founding members are still dancing today! Of course, as the club has aged, so have its members. Therefore, to help ensure our club members survive a life-threatening event during its club night, the RSC Board decided to invest in life-saving devices and training. The RSC Board encourages other ACSC member shag clubs to follow Richmond's example.
