Other charities, needy individuals and worthy causes have been supported by SOS, too.

WHIT BLANTON-SUMTER SHAG CLUB

Whit Blanton has been one of the most active members of the Sumter Shag Club for the past decade, during which he has served as president and chaired multiple committees. He has assumed significant responsibilities within the club and effectively coordinated numerous fundraising events.

During his seven-year tenure as president, the membership increased from 82 to 233, a new high for the Sumter Shag Club. He set goals for the club and accomplished tasks that needed to be done. He regularly posts updates and opportunities on the club's Facebook page and promotes club events on a local Sumter Radio station. Having served nine years as the Party Planner and Decoration chair, the club now hosts 9 large events annually, along with smaller gatherings. With his committed guidance both inside the club and in the local community, the club has continued to thrive and expand.

She has conducted workshops for her club and other sister clubs. As a member of the Association of Beach and Shag Club DJs, she has served as the club's DJ every other week since 2015.

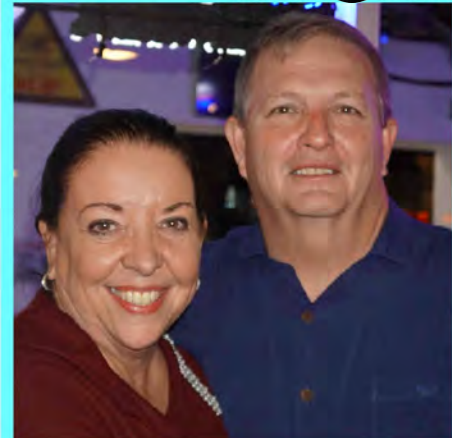
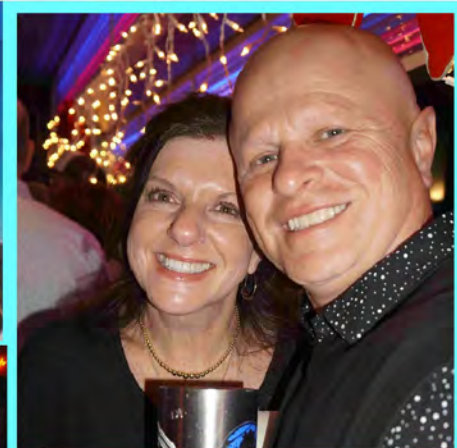

"OUR TIME" Celebrates 38th Anniversary

The Our Time organization celebrated their 38th anniversary on February 13 & 14, 2026. The 2026 Our Time event was held at the O.D. Beach and Golf Resort.

Our Time was organized in 1987 when a group of like-minded individuals came together with the intent of forming an organization of "Old Timers" to meet on an annual or semi-annual basis. In a subsequent meeting in 1987, the founding members decided that the organization would be known as "Our Time".

The founding members wanted the organization to focus on the "Older Music" (no disco or Motown) as well as controlling the maximum attendance. It was decided by the founding members that this goal of attendance would be obtained by establishing hosts that could invite up to 12 couples. It was agreed to limit the number of hosts to 25. This limit of hosts is still valid. Currently, hosts have the ability to invite up to 12 couples. Over the years, we have had hosts retire, and unfortunately, we have lost too many hosts over the past 38 years. When it is necessary to replace hosts, the remaining hosts nominate and vote on the new hosts.

The very first Our Time was held at Harold's on the weekend of February 5th and 6th, 1988. In the following years, Our Time was held at various locations in North Myrtle Beach with the weekend immediately preceding President's Day (third Monday in February) being agreed to in 1989 as the best weekend for the party since some members/guests did have President's Day off as it is recognized as a federal holiday. The President's Day weekend also provides lower lodging rates due to this period of time being considered the off season for North Myrtle Beach. To this day, with very few exceptions, the guidance of our founding members is still being adhered to today.

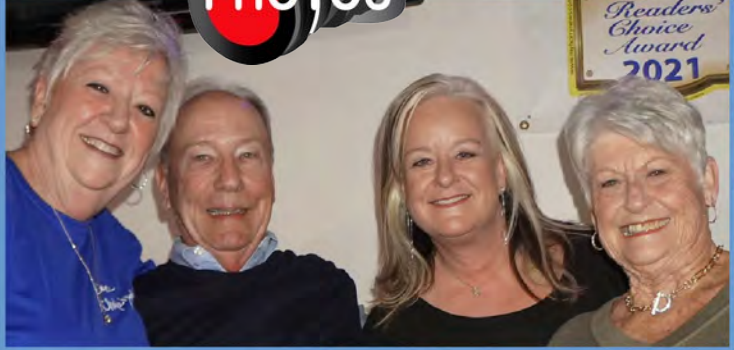
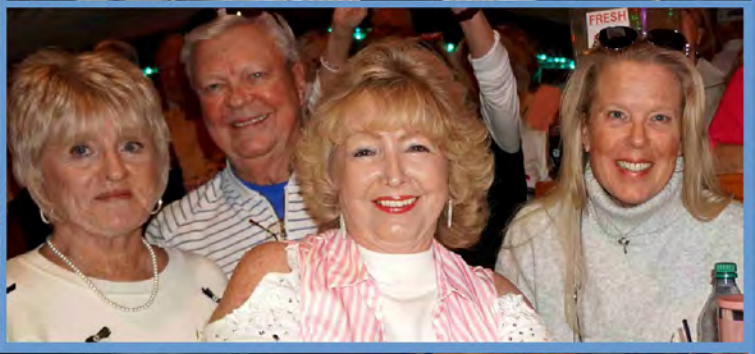

The Virginia Beach Shag Club; 40 Years of Dancing, Music, and Community Service

It is 6:00 PM on a Wednesday evening and the parking lot at DanceSportVA dance studio is filling up fast. Inside members are finding their preferred tables, getting ready for the dancing to begin. Club president Jack Witzendorf, greets members and visitors alike welcoming everyone as they come into the ballroom. Meanwhile the DJ announces the line dance class for the evening. Tommy Speight is the instructor for tonight's class which is the Tush Push...the floor fills rapidly.

After the line dance class in the junior ballroom next door, Ron and Linda Bessent begin a Basic Carolina Shag lesson teaching the fundamentals of the dance. The men are a little nervous at first, but quickly relax when they realize that everyone is a beginner at this point, and the objective is to have fun while learning something new. With the encouragement from the instructors, everyone in the class seems to relax and enjoy learning the basic steps as their journey into the Shag dance community begins.

In the main ballroom, the lights go down as DJ Gary US Barnes takes over with a moderate beat R&B song. The floor fills as shaggers begin to move back and forth in the traditional eight step pattern of the Carolina Shag. Dancers of all levels and ages are enjoying the music and socializing with their friends. So goes the weekly Mix & Mingle at the Virginia Beach Shag Club (VBSC).

So, what is the Carolina Shag? Basically, it is a couples' dance that evolved from the fast dances of the 1930's, 40's, and 50's such as the Lindy, Jitterbug and Bop. However, the shag is a slower smoother version focusing on footwork and form. Most shaggers try and portray a smooth style with the best dancers appearing to slide across the floor. The music we dance to is written in a 4/4 time, usually 110 to 135 beats per minute. Many of these songs were performed by early Soul, Motown, and Blues artists and played on the juke boxes and clubs along the coasts of North and South Carolina, thus the term "Beach Music" associated with the dance. However, dancers can shag to various types of music including R&B, Pop, and even Country music. The Shag is the state dance of both North and South Carolina.

The Basic step is the foundation of all steps in shag. It is a six count, eight step pattern with couples mirroring each other in an up and back movement. Males start on their left foot while females start on their right. The pattern and count is as follows: 1 & 2 count: Step up on the 1, step together on the "&", step back on the 2; 3 & 4 count: step back in the 3, step in place on the & - 4 counts; 5 - 6: step back on the 5 and step forward on the 6.

The VBSC is a social, non-profit 501(c-7) dance club. Its mission is to bring people together with mutual interests in shag dancing, socializing, developing friendships, promoting beach music and supporting the community through special events and charitable fund raising. To that end, the VBSC has participated in many local events such as the annual Beach Music Festival, shag demonstrations, and dances at local assisted living facilities. The club's primary charitable organization is Edmarc for Children to which this past year the club donated over \$13,000.00.

Additionally, the club conducts fund raisers and supply collections for the local food bank and school children and teachers in Virginia Beach. This past year the club raised over \$3,000 for the families of the two VB police officers that were killed in the line of duty. This was presented to the Virginia Beach Police Officers Foundation for distribution to the families. Also, the club sent donations to the flood victims in Southwestern Virginia and to those in Eastern and Western North Carolina.

The Virginia Beach Shag club was founded in 1985 and has a current membership of over 250. We dance every Wednesday at DanceSportVA located at 5721 Arrowhead Drive in Virginia Beach. Doors open at 6:00 PM and we

dance until 9:30 PM. Dance lessons, both line dances and shag lessons, are conducted during every Mix & Mingle. New Beginner classes are held approximately four times a year and include the basic fundamental steps, beyond basic, and intermediate steps. Additionally, the VBSC provides Basic Shag lessons at the Princess Anne and Kempsville Recreation Centers (contact the recreation centers for more information on these classes).

THE WILD, WILD WEST OF SHAG

JIM HERN, CSA PRESIDENT

The history and evolution of competitive Shag dance can easily spark passionate conversation — and for good reason. Its early days were wild: a freewheeling blues era fueled by rhythmic music, late-night parties, and dance contests that drew hundreds of patrons and dozens of competitors. Those marathon multiday contests paid handsome prizes and kept devoted dancers traveling from weekend to weekend, chasing the next party and the next win. I have taken the liberty to call that era the “Wild, Wild West of Shag”.

Most modern dancers know the story only through the accounts from aging participants, archival videos, and a few written records. Few of today’s competitive dancers experienced that scene firsthand, so much of what we know is secondhand or inferred. Still, the contrast between that competitive, anything-goes era and today’s organized scene is striking.

As juke joints declined and social pressures changed, the freewheeling competitive lifestyle became less practical. However, recognizing the need for a more sustainable, community-focused competitive path, a few wise shag enthusiasts of that era created the Shag Preservation Association (SPA) then followed that by the Competitive Shaggers Association (CSA). From that transition and for more than 30 years now, CSA has emerged as the primary competitive platform for shag dancers, nurturing talent and offering a clear progression from amateur and novice divisions to professional ranks.

CSA, in conjunction with supporting event hosts, conducts events throughout the Southeast and provides an encouraging environment where dancers can grow, compete, and be recognized professionally. The organization plays a major role in preserving the expressive artistry of shag while keeping competition accessible and supportive.

Like the dance itself, CSA has evolved. Competitors today skew older, and events tend to feel more social and slightly more relaxed than the raucous contests of the past. Yet the drive to excel remains strong: dancers still train hard, chase improvement, and push the art form forward.

Looking ahead, the future of both social and competitive shag depends on attracting younger dancers and making wise choices to showcase the dance’s excitement and cultural value.
